

TURKEY

CATA1 **APRON** Turkey. Kocakovacik village, Bursa/Keles, Marmara Region (from an article in the Textile Museum Journal 2001-2 Vol. 40 -41. Article by Ronald Marchese "Charms and Amulets in Turkish Life". Woven in 3 – 6 ¾ inch strips of natural brown and white wool in warp stripes, slightly felted during tie dying (circles). Strips sewn together and piece edged with colorful cotton or rayon? Yarn in blanket? Stitch. No apron ties. 20 X 29 inches

CATA2 APRON most likely Turkey because it came with the Barbara

Woodward estate 2016. Weft faced wool and acrylic weave with pick and pick, spot brocade, and twined blue and gold stripes and Tapestry woven edge top and bottom turned sideways (now Left and Right edge). Crochet or a naturally lumpy yarn around the whole piece. 23 Long 20 Wide. Cardwoven? apron string







CASH4 Turkish Scarf. "Real gold and silver" embroidered on gauze weight cotton. From Erda Kappeler



CAT3 Large Cotton Cloth Adriane Nicolaisen thinks is a Turkish towel. The Whole piece is 46 X 85 inches, made of pieces sewn together. The two central panels are each 14 X 75 inches of blue and white cotton with diamond weave ends with occasional inlay of red in a diamond. The red, white and blue bands—one on each edge are 10 inches wide. The top and bottom red, white and blue bands are 4 ½ inches wide and have occasional weft "tufts"





Fergana, Uzbekistan. Adult woman's "veiling" coat (*Parandja*). Urban Tadjik Uzbek. Meant to be worn over the head like a cape when out in public, with horsehair face mask (see below). Gray cotton? With black embroidery accents (neck, opening and bottom edge), purple pocket surround and opening edge(that has stained of onto the coat fabric). Lined with chartreuse cotton and scraps of ikat) Has vestigial (un-useable) sleeves that drape down the back. Richard Kilday bought on a trip to Central Asia in 2009?. 



CAHA2 Hat. blue, green, gold flowers and wreaths? on brown background. Green and red hook and eye design around the lower edge. Entirely Chain stitched. With a blue cotton lining. 20 inch circumference at the base. From the Barbara Woodward estate BW #5





CAHA3 Hat Apricot colored silk? Acetate? with loop and spiral design in white and metallic machine chain stitch on crown and edges. Lined with white cotton. 20 inch circumference at the base. From the Barbara Woodward estate BW #11

CAHA4 Metal studs on top, Same stitch as used on Chirpy coats (a type of button hole stitch? resembling a figure 8—see Suzani article in notebook) in classic black, red, gold, and white. Diamonds around the bottom edge.

Circle on top. 18 inch circumference at the base. From the Barbara Woodward estate BW #3



CAHA5

Silk Ikat Hat. blue, red, gold on pink background. Rectangular top form.

Machine stitched black cotton edge.

Lined with cotton print and stripe fabric. From the Barbara Woodward

CAHA6 **Hat**. Same stitch as used on Chirpy coats (a type of button hole stitch? Resembling a figure 8) in classic black, orange, and white stitchery "E" form on red cotton fabric background. Lined with muslin. Unusually tall (6 inches). 20 inch circumference at the base.






