

at a Thrift Shop.












CAR11 Saddle Bag James Cook and Terry Lyon bought on their travels Knotted pile (wool) with gols and borders, plain weave stripe back








CAR12 "Kelim" flat weave tapestry rug.

SW, NA,NRT2 Small Ganado Saddle Blanket. Ganado, Navajo. 1900? 17 X 34" Red = respun commercial yarn. From George Howell (Leslie Humphrey)




